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## Progress Monitoring Data Flow

1. **Daily:** Student/teacher records progress on a **DPR**
2. **Weekly:** Coordinator summarizes daily DPR onto a **WPR**
3. **Monthly:** Coordinator summarizes WPR to calculate a **MPR**



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## Daily Progress Monitoring

- If the student is progressing, they should continue until no longer needed
- If the student is not progressing, adjust program and/or another layer of support should be added.



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If the intervention is evidence-based and was provided based on a data decision-rule, but ODR's are still high, it's more likely that the intervention is simply "not enough"

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## Weekly Progress Monitoring

- Documented by the intervention Coordinator
- Used to determine trends in student performance



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## Data-Based Decision Making

- Data is increasing...
- Data is flat...
- Data is decreasing...



The point of collecting data is to use it to make decisions. Use the WPR to decide if a student's current interventions are effective or need to be adjusted.

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## Why Is It Not Working???

- Not enough
- Not a match
- Low frequency
- Low attendance
- Low fidelity
- Low motivation
- Mismatched personnel
- No time
- No personnel



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## Weekly Progress Report (WPR)

Student	Mon	Tues	Wed	Thurs	Fri	GOAL	Summary
Anna	67%	72%	88%	70%	92%	80%	78%
Ben	92%	95%	90%	95%	95%	80%	94%
Carla	60%	35%	55%	25%	30%	50%	41%



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## Monthly Progress Monitoring

- Calculated by the intervention Coordinator
- Reviewed at the Tier 2 Team meeting
- Used to make decisions about the fidelity of each intervention



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## Monthly Progress Monitoring

- Used to measure program fidelity:
  - If most students in the program are responding...
  - If most students are not responding...



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Review the program to determine what needs to change: training for the coordinator, the staff, the students or the family component (if appropriate).

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## Monthly Percent Responding (MPR)

$$\frac{\# \text{ Students Responding}}{\# \text{ Students Enrolled}} = \text{Percent Responding}$$



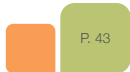
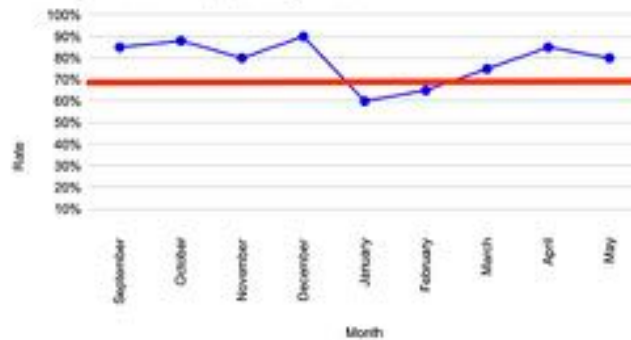
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A rate of over 70% should be the goal for all intervention programs.

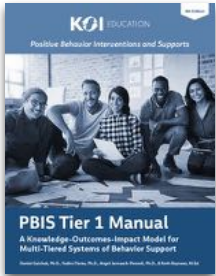
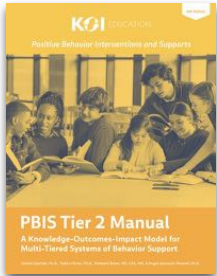
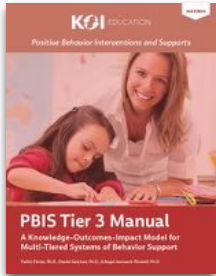
