Apply three DR strategies to real classroom examples.

Example: Sally taps her pencil or talks-out 30-40 times within a class period. Teacher uses DRL to reinforce Sally for tapping or talking-out less than 10 times within a class period.

DRI : Differential Reinforcement of INCOMPATIBLE Behavior	Example: Sally taps her pencil or talks-out 30-40 times within a class period. Teacher uses DRI to reinforce Sally every time she puts pencil to paper and begins to write (instead of tapping) or completes her worksheet silently (instead of talking-out).

OMISSION of BehaviorExample: Sally has had problems keeping her hands to herself and has
frequently hit others when they said or did something she didn't like.
Teacher uses DRO to reinforce Sally each 15 min. interval that she
refrains from hitting other. Consequences still occur for all instances of
